



LEGISLATIVE NEWS

August 2020 Legislative Report

Even though these mid-summer months are considered "legislative down time," we've been spending time familiarizing ourselves with the list of candidates up for election, or re-election, at both the state level and congressional level. We are coming up on a very busy and important election session this year. Keep in mind that pushing our issues and our bills through the legislature is only half the battle - electing officials who support our causes and conduct themselves as our representatives is just as important for our legislative success. We would like to encourage everyone to spend a little time reviewing the candidates in their district who are up for election.

In the July edition of the Freedom, we presented a list of the Bills that were being considered for this biennium. Since then, another suggestion was brought forth for consideration. There is interest in creating a Bill that would address right lane shoulder riding for motorcyclists. This bill was suggested by Brian Lange (who will hopefully win the 20th district seat) so we will be giving it some consideration along with our other bills for this biennium:

- -- Helmet Pilot Bill
- -- Lane Sharing Bill
- -- Weight Fee this one may be delayed due to it's financial issues
- -- New one suggested Handicap parking space allowance this bill would allow more than one bike per handicap spot if at least one bike has a decal
- -- New one suggested Awareness Bill this bill would detail measures designed to increase motorcycle awareness on roadways.
- -- New one suggested Right Lane Shoulder Riding .

How ABATE will proceed with our Legislative efforts has yet to be voted on as the July BOD has yet to take place at the time of writing this article. We will keep everyone posted on the outcome of the BOD voting results.

We would like to give a big "thumbs Up" to Missouri for the passage of their Helmet Choice Bill into Law! This new law will take effect August 2020!. Abate for Missouri certainly did a great job with this legislative effort!

We would also like to thank the MRF for all their hard work keeping motorcycle interests in the spotlight with the "Highway Bill," H.R.2. This 2,000 plus page bill includes three important protections for motorcyclists. These protections are:

Sec 3011: Stop Motorcycle Check Point Funding, which helps protect motorcyclists from profiling by law enforcement because of their mode of transportation or clothing.

Sec. 3012: Motorcyclist Advisory Council would be reestablished, allowing motorcyclists a seat at the table when discussing federal infrastructure programs.

Section 5304: Study on Safe Interactions Between Automated Vehicles and Road Users ensures that motorcycles are included in any safety study on autonomous vehicles and that motorcyclists are involved in government working groups on these autonomous vehicle studies

Remember - spend some time reviewing the Legislators and Candidates who cover your district!. Go to the state legislative web page (www.leg.wa.gov), find your district, and review your candidates (www.sos.wa.gov), I'll be preparing a summary of Legislators who have favored our efforts but, I can't do it alone - so step up, visit the state legislative web page and do a little investigating for the good of our favorite pastime and lifestyle.

What the Jury Doesn't Get to Hear By Mike Myers



The rules of evidence have a big impact on what the jury gets to hear (and what it doesn't get to hear about the case). A lot of the rules are counterintuitive.

Here's what the jury <u>doesn't get to hear</u> in a motorcycle injury case:

- 1. The amount defendant offered to pay before trial. In most cases defendants make offers before trial. But at trial the jury never hears what the defendant was willing to pay and the last offer does not set a floor for the verdict.
- The defendant has insurance. At trial defense lawyers love to insinuate their clients are going to have to pay the full amount of the verdict. Nothing could be further from the truth. But the jury never gets to hear that the insurance company will be paying the verdict.
- 3. When the defendant admitted fault. A lot of times defendants deny they were at fault from the day of the wreck all the way up to the night before trial. Then, almost magically, they admit fault on the courthouse steps. The jury never gets to hear that the earnest, accountable defendant denied that they caused the wreck for years.
- 4. The defendant caused 10 other wrecks. A lot of clients want the jury to hear that the defendant caused 10 other wrecks and is a menace to society. The rules of evidence don't allow the jury to hear about these kinds of "past bad acts."
- The defendant was drunk or high. This is probably the most controversial. Many judges take the view that if the defendant admits he was at-fault for the wreck, the jury doesn't get to find out that he was drunk or stoned.

- The defendant was texting. If liability is admitted, the jury never finds out that the defendant was texting.
- 7. The defendant was cited (or the injured person was not cited). Evidence about whether a citation was issued (or not issued) doesn't come into evidence—the jury never hears about it.
- 8. The defendant never checked on the injured person or asked what they could do to help. What's the best way to truly accept responsibility for hurting someone else? To try to make things right. But the jury isn't going to hear the defendant never checked on the injured person, never offered to drive them to the doctor, and never offered to pay for their medical bills.
- 9. What similar cases are worth. The jurors are appraisers. Their job is to figure out what the injured person's damages are worth. But the jury is never going to hear that in a very similar case the jury awarded \$1.45M. It's a little like an appraiser potentially saying a house is worth \$100,000 when the ones on either side sold for \$1.55M and \$1.4M.
- 10. Argument that the jury should put themselves in the shoes of the injured person. How do we typically "understand" things that happen to other people? How do we "empathize" with other people? We put ourselves in the other person's shoes. Unfortunately, the judge won't allow attorneys to encourage the jury to use this commonsense way of understanding what happened to the injured person.
- 11. Where the money goes after the verdict is paid. The jury isn't told the injured person has to pay back their insurance companies. Or that the injured person has to pay their attorney's fees and costs. The jury is never told that in the U.S. we don't have a "loser-pays" system and that even though defendant forced the injured person to go to trial, the defendant doesn't have to absorb the injured person's fees and costs.

These rules may not seem fair. But it's important to know about them.

We have a new event scheduled for July 24th – 26th at John Berg's place in Morton. This will be a camp-out party and again...check out our Facebook page for more information.




