NCOM conference 2013

I guess this adventure might have started as long as almost a year and a half ago. That's when my wife, Marjorie, first broke herself. She broke herself three times last year and what those breaks were is not important; what is important is that she spent most of the year recuperating and not riding with me. Then about a month ago a car crowded me into a pinch point on a small road, somehow I hooked something with my foot and I'm still limping around with a certain amount of pain. This was to be our first chance at distance together in almost two years.

We were going to the NCOM National Convention in Reno. The National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM) is a function of Aid to Injured Motorcyclists (AIM) a group of Attorneys who offer their services to the motorcycle community. In return they fund the various activities of NCOM through their earnings; there is no cost to groups or individuals for being members of NCOM. Being the NCOM Ambassador for ABATE of Washington puts me on the Board of Directors for the National organization, therefore I have to be at the National a day earlier than everyone else to attend Board meetings.

Marjorie and I left Seattle Monday the 6th of May and rode to our friends Scott & Micki Robinson in Goldendale WA. A short, casual two hundred mile ride being a nice way to start a journey, and a short visit with good friends something that just adds to the adventure. The weather was in the 80's on Tuesday when we headed south on 97. First gas in Redmond OR and breakfast in Bend; the weather was still holding. But, as we continued south the day became greyer and the temperature slowly fell. Just north of Klamath Falls the skies opened in a short hail storm; didn't slow us down much, but heard it was much worse for some who followed. The skies got steadily thicker and as we entered Klamath Falls the lightening and rain thundered down on us; there was easily two inches (or more) of water running in the street as we threaded our way through the small southern Oregon community.

We turned south east on 39 and before we knew it we were in Tulelake and California, the rain had eased and the speed limit risen. 39 became 139 and we were headed for Susanville CA. Rain showers came and went

as we traveled over passes that were routinely over 5,000 feet in the air. As we came down in elevation to enter Susanville there was a feeling of the worst being behind us. It was here we caught Rt. 395 for the last dash into Reno and the rain. Not a shower, but solid, steady, relentless, soaking RAIN; kinda just like home. At Bordertown we pulled in for our last gas up, dinner and to let our friend in Reno know we were there; we each held cups of decaf coffee until the chills went away. We had been on the road eleven hours, on mostly two lane roads in extremely inclement weather for almost the last half of the journey---nice way to start the riding season.

On Wednesday, after spending the night with our friend, I left Marjorie in her care and continued into Reno to the Silver Legacy Casino & Resort, where our convention was to be held. I got settled into the room and began to look for others as they straggled in. People were coming in from all over the country, but of course those from our little corner of the world are always most important in my mind. Many rode, but others because of family, job or other considerations flew in; it didn't matter to me I was glad to see them all. Three of the people that seemed to have an extreme impact on the convention were my friends and Brothers of the road Double D and Twitch from the Outsiders MC and my brother in politics Donnie "Mr. Breeze" Landsman the Legislative Affairs Officer of ABATE of Washington.

If you have been living under a rock and haven't heard that Double D wrote a book, you might want to wake up and get a copy---they're available on Amazon.com. It's his take on the passing of the Anti-profiling bill in the state of Washington, as well as other essays giving insight to him and the culture he lives in. It is Double D's contention that we have abdicated the telling of our story to people who don't care about us; they care only about sensationalism they can wring from the lifestyle, not the caring, not the giving, not the sense of family we see on a daily basis, not the struggle to maintain our sense of worth and identity. He says we need to take back the telling of our story in our words---I agree with him. Get a copy of the book it's called "Black Thursday" by David "Double D" Devereaux.

On Thursday it was Board of Director's meetings for me all day with the accompanying reports from each of the regions and scheduling and other minutia that accompanies those sorts of affairs. Friday began in earnest the information sharing for which we had come together. Two side by side seminars on legislative and legal issues of a National nature with the Opening Ceremonies happening after the lunch break. Our success here in the Pacific Northwest is still a major topic of discussion and it seemed as if every session had one or more of the individuals (especially the three afore mentioned individuals) from Washington taking a lead in the discussions. From Partners in Liberty (how to get Clubs and MRO's working together) to the US Defenders program to Anti-Profiling it seemed at least one of the three, if not all, was holding center stage.

Other special meetings for the weekend included "Women in Motorcycling", "Clean and Sober Round Table", "World of Sport Bikes" and "Christian Unity Conference." Seminars involved "Your Rights during a Traffic Stop" and for the first time a Seminar on Veterans Rights with a member of the regional VA there to present information and answer specific questions from Veterans present. Friday afternoon consisted of the various Confederations of Clubs from all over the country reporting in general session on their activities. Saturday afternoon were the regional breakouts where we got to hear from other states concerning legislative and legal issues. Saturday evening was the traditional "Silver Spoke Award Banquet" and for all intents and purposes the close of the event.

Marjorie came for the Banquet and Sunday morning we packed up and headed north with Scott Robinson and Michael "Critter" Campbell both officers of ABATE of Washington. The weather was in the eighties and continued that way for us all the way into the state (Critter cut off early and I heard had a number of miles of rainy riding.) We once again spent a wonderful night in Goldendale with our friends and were back in Seattle just as the thunder storm was starting. I was pretty sure the weather gods would not give us a free pass to get home dry---and I was right.



VOTING @ STATE BOD MEETING

Let's do the math. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure this out. Each chapter in ABATE of Washington, gets represented by their chapter coordinator at the quarterly BOD meetings. Thus giving each chapter only one vote, per issue, at each meeting. Presently, we have three chapters that are getting TWO votes, and one that is getting THREE votes, because those four chapters have a member that is a state officer! Think about it...those extra votes can cause your chapter to lose on an issue that may be of importance to your chapter! How is that fair, for those chapters to get two or three votes, while the rest of us only get one??

To explain it further, each state officer...State

Coordinator, state deputy coordinator, state secretary, and state treasurer, are already represented by THEIR chapter coordinator.... Each of their coordinators gets to vote on the issues. If each of those state officers gets to vote as well, (which they do) then those four chapters, are getting an extra vote! Giving those four chapters extra votes, while the rest of the chapters, are only getting one!! Do ya get it?

This came to my attention from a friend of mine who belongs to ABATE of Oregon. Frankly, I think we need to change our State Bylaws to be the same as ABATE of Oregon. Those guys have the right idea. It's called 'FAIRNESS'. Motorcycle fatality statistics refute claims that helmet-optional law increases rate

Control freaks are relentless in their quest to stamp out the evil of individual freedom wherever they find it.

From compulsory sectarian religion, to book burnings, to Prohibition I (alcohol), to Prohibition II (drugs), to sex, they get their way, although not always permanently.

Nothing illustrates the idea of freedom more than the sight of somebody riding a motorcycle bareheaded. The failure to win total victory in that category drives those in the "we're doing this for your own good" crowd to distraction. And they are willing to finagle statistics in almost comical variations to try to make their point.

On Wednesday, the Governors Highway Safety Administration released a report on the horrors of allowing people to ride motorcycles without helmets and stories on the report were published by the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette and The Philadelphia Inquirer.

That's where the numbers get a little confusing. The Post-Gazette said the GHSA report reflected a 5.5 percent increase in Pennsylvania's motorcycle fatalities, comparing 2012 to 2011. The Inquirer said it was a 7.6 percent increase, but that was just for the first nine months of each year.

The GHSA report at first said the Pennsylvania increase was 8 percent, and then later said it was 7.6 percent. It also said the U.S. increase in fatalities for 2012 was 9 percent, but that's based on estimated "underreporting" and the actual numbers reflect a 4.3 percent increase for the nation

In any case, all the increases in motorcycle fatalities are because of a "disturbing trend" — the fact that most states now let adults decide for themselves whether they want to take the no-helmet risk.

"The single most effective thing to do about motorcycle deaths is to have a universal helmet law," GHSA spokesman Jonathan Adkins was quoted as saying. The association, one of the stories said, "renewed its call for Pennsylvania and other states to reimpose universal helmet laws."

Pennsylvania's compulsory helmet law was changed in 2003 to allow qualified adult motorcyclists (of which I'm one) to decide for themselves, as is also the case in all states except those in the behavior-control Bible Belt and a few others.

Regarding the statistics used to support compulsory helmets for all, I started with the GHSA's own numbers.

The association's report says there were 34 states with increased motorcycle fatality rates in 2012, 16 states with declining rates, and one state where the rate was unchanged. In fairness, I think they counted the District of

Columbia as a state, but you can see how somebody could get confused.

More to the point, the GHSA provided charts designed to show graphically how bad the problem has become. Ironically, the actual numbers do just the opposite.

For example, three states, Missouri, Wisconsin and Indiana, had the most dramatic changes in the rate of motorcycle fatalities for 2012. Missouri was the worst, with a 29 percent increase, Wisconsin was best with a 31 percent drop, and Indiana also did well with a 29 percent decrease. The report avoids mentioning that Missouri has compulsory helmets, while Wisconsin and Indiana are free-choice states.

So much for a "disturbing trend."

On one chart, Pennsylvania was said to have had a 7.6 percent increase in motorcycle fatalities for the first nine months of 2012, from 171 in 2011 to 184 in 2012.

That's awful, and I have repeatedly stressed the point that motorcycles are indeed dangerous, far more dangerous than cars, because of the vulnerability factor. A collision between a two-wheeler and a four-wheeler almost always goes one way. Some of us feel the fun is worth the risk, as is the case in other risky activities, from mountain climbing to skateboarding.

I've been riding motorized two-wheelers since the 1950s, and I feel helmets do more harm than good because they restrict vision and sound, their weight results in broken necks, and, worst of all, they provide a false sense of security. Also, head injuries are far more a factor in car crashes, but don't hold your breath waiting for control freaks to find the courage to demand helmets in cars.

The most meaningful statistics, however, were provided by Craig Yetter, spokesman for the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's Safety Administration. His charts showed there were 156 motorcycle fatalities in the state in 2003, the year in which the law was changed to make helmets optional. In 2012, there were 210. That's an increase of 34.6 percent, enough to make control freaks go into hysterics.

A comparison of Pennsylvania motorcycle registrations for those two years, however, shows an increase from 265,054 to 409,017, thanks, I'm sure, to the appeal of freedom. That's a jump of 54.3 percent.

Therefore, if fatalities are increasing 34.6 percent at the same time registrations are up 54.3 percent, it means significantly fewer motorcyclists are being killed per each 1,000 motorcycles on the road.

Obviously, at least in Pennsylvania, the availability of choice (along with the ability to see and hear better, etc.) is saving lives.

That, I regret to say, will cause the control freaks untold distress, but only if they look at the actual statistics and then do a little simple math, which is unlikely because it does not fit their agenda.





Policies for the ABATE Newsletter

The deadline for submissions to the ABATE Newsletter is the 15th of the month prior to publication.

Chapter reports must be submitted by the Chapter Coordinator, Deputy Coordinator or a person authorized by the Chapter Coordinator in writing.

Chapter announcements and flyers are free with the following restrictions:

Chapters are limited to one full page ad per month If the event is during the first week of the month, then a full page ad is allowed in the previous month's issue.

If the event is not in the first week of the month, the full page ad is limited to the issue published in the month of the event.

Chapters may place ½ page ads for up to two months prior to the event except for the issue that the full page ad is inserted. Chapters may not have a ½ page ad and a full page ad for the same event in the same issue. Full page ads may be allowed if there is space available in months prior to the month of the event at the sole discretion of the Newsletter Team.

All flyers submitted for publication for Chapter events must have "ABATE of Washington" and the Chapter name at the top of the flyer. Use of the ABATE logo is optional. Any flyers submitted without this information will not be considered Chapter events and will be subject to policies contained in these rules. This may require payment before the flyer can be published.

Charities with 501 (c) (3) status must submit a copy of their IRS status letter to the Newsletter Team before their ad can be published. All events must be motorcycle related. There is no charge for charities to place ads under these conditions on a space available basis. If there is no space available, the charity has the option to pay for the ad at current published rates.

No other discounts or free ads will be allowed.

Commissions: Any ABATE member or Chapter may earn 10% on any ads sold for the newsletter.

One of the most frequent questions asked of me is: "how do I respond during the pull over?" Personally being reluctant to give an answer and I would like to try and sum it up. Law Enforcement Establishments provide "in service" personnel with an academy where training occurs. Once an officer is assigned to a precinct there are vast opportunities for more training. Some training is mandatory by law annually. It is pretty safe to say that Law enforcement officers are trained to a proven standard that creates evidence able to convict citizens in court. Officers can lie to your face, deceive you, write false reports, lead you into a conversation then eventually gain probable cause to search. Officers are not actually able to commit a crime to lead you into a crime that is one "thin blue line". Officers are trained to lead a suspect to admit guilt. It is hard to pin point which approach will be used on you during your stop. That is why me personally I do not like to answer this question. Knowing your rights is about the best advice during the stop. Understanding what grounds you can be detained for and simply ask them first "Am I being detained?" Be polite! Officers are always collecting evidence against you. For us to counter their tactics we must know our rights. What enforcement can do during a stop? "The stop" for example the officer pulls us over on the helmet issue. The officer will approach you and ask for your license. Be polite and ask "Am I being detained?" If the answer is Yes", then ask "What law did I allegedly break?" The officer might respond: That is an illegal helmet! Do not argue! RCW 46.37.530 clearly defines a helmet as a hard outer shell with a liner, chin strap and the DOT sticker. If your helmet meets the law's standard (RCW 46.37.530) the officer has no Probable Cause (PC) to seize your property or detain you. Do not make any statements! You must show your license, registration, and proof of insurance if you are not in Washington State. What's next? Be brief and germane. "I know my helmet meets the standard of the law am I free to go?" Do not consent to any search of you or your vehicle without a visible warrant. Be polite and careful what you say again remember they are well trained to meet the burden of proof required

by court to convict. The argument is not with the officer it is with the lawmakers and in the courts. There is absolutely no doubt the laws are being abused by In-service personnel, especially Washington State Patrol. What are we going to do? In ABATE's Citation Committee we are fighting infractions in court and at the conclusion we are asking for a settlement of reasonable costs and fees. In other words the time and money it cost the citizen to fight for his rights is worth more than the on duty officers time to falsely accuse us. It is all new efforts and thus far we have several interested and competent people participating. We are forming a citations team. -The following statement is from Matt Danielson an attorney and member of The Motorcycle Law Group -The helmet argument against what you described is one of lack of probable cause. If the officer sees you wearing a helmet with a hard shell, a chin strap and an outer DOT label that appears on the outer surface, in a color that contrasts with the background, in letters at least 3/8 inch (1 cm) high, centered laterally with the horizontal centerline of the symbol located a minimum of 1 1/8 inches (2.9 cm) and a maximum of 1 3/8 inches (3.5 cm) from the bottom edge of the posterior portion of the helmet (obviously close will be good enough as no one can tell that simply by looking at it) then before the officer could force you to remove the helmet he would have to have probable cause that the helmet has no inner label with the specifications the standard requires. He would have to be able to explain to the court why he has probable cause to seize your property. He will be unable to do that as all they can point to is size and weight of the helmet as well as padding none of which, as you know, are addressed in the standard. "If an officer were to ask me to remove the helmet I would politely tell him that I do not believe that he has probable cause to seize my property and that I do not consent and will not remove my helmet. However if he feels he has Probable Cause I will not resist you removing it from me but I will not assist you in violating my rights-." More to Follow...good day my brother!


