



OFFICER REPORTS



From the State Coordinator Lyle Coyle

Hi everyone. This has been one messed up year so far and it is beyond belief the varying opinions you have on this shut down. It started with our Swap Meet, when Scott Robinson called to tell me the Monroe fairgrounds canceled our even. It was devastating to hear. All of the plans, the prep work, the plans were flushed down with one phone call.

We started talks right then and there on Spring Opener. We decided that we would move forward with the event as if there were no issues because we believed this would be all done by then. Then that day when Governor Inslee came out with his four phases for reopening Washington we knew we were doomed but we still were trying to hold out a little hope because of it being on the other side of the mountains. After a number of calls with no hope in site we decided to cancel the Spring Opener. First time in 42 years. With the announcement of canceling Spring

Opener we received varying responses from people who were planning on going to the event, some said they understood and it was for the best, some said they didn't understand why but there is always next year, and then there were the ones who were pissed off saying we caved, we should just go have the event no matter what the Governor and Kittitas county says. So here I will tell you why we canceled. It came down to law, money, and the existence of ABATE of Washington.

First we are at the mercy of Kittitas County, we have to have a special event permit to have our event so no permit no event and the county said they will abide by whatever the Governor decided.


Second was the money. It cost upwards of 50 thousands of dollars to put on this event, this is money that under the current situation we would more than likely loose. There is also the point that some of our scheduled vendors were canceling and because of all of the businesses being shut down there was no place for members to actively sell raffle tickets so there is potentially a loss of another 30 thousand dollars.

Then there is ABATE of Washington, if we were to defy the Governor and the county and say we were going to have the event no matter what there would be a 99.9 percent chance the state would pull our not for profit status, our Articles of Incorporation, so we would no longer be a legitimate motorcycle rights organization, we would no longer be able to fight for motorcycle rights on the level we do now, everything that we and all the people before us have done would now be over. Believe me this was an extremely difficult decision, no one wanted to really do it but it was done for the good of ABATE of Washington and its members.

So what is going to happen now, If you bought a spring opener ticket it will be good for next year or your money will be refunded, if you bought a raffle ticket it will be good for next year or your money will be refunded. I hope everyone will be patient and help us work through this so we can all work for the betterment of ABATE of Washington.

Diversity is about all of us, and about us having to figure out how to walk through this world together.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

June 2020 Legislative Report

These next few months, what I call "down time" in our legislative efforts, we will spend time examining our strongest motorcycle issues and reviewing the current Legislators as well as the new candidates expected to run for the November election. We will also be paying attention to motorcycle reports in general (i.e., news articles, crashes, events, runs, etc).

Obviously there are fewer runs and events so far this year due to "gathering restrictions". The summaries and guidelines being issued regularly by the Governor's

office regarding phases for lifting restrictions have included specific activities such as ATVs, horseback riding and motocross but say nothing about MC safety classes or businesses. We will keep monitoring our social restrictions.

Speaking of motorcycle safety, there have been way too many motorcycle crashes (yes, even one crash is too many) so far this year. Some of these crashes have been due to rider carelessness and recklessness. ABATE's purpose is primarily to promote motorcycling activities and protect motorcycling rights and safety. One of our biggest efforts as an organization, is to educate Legislators about motorcycle rights and to push for safety legislation that promotes freedom of choice for motorcycling activities. Hand in hand with educating Legislators is (or should be) our effort to promote a positive perception of motorcycles on roadways to the public. Keep in mind that every motorcycle crash diminishes our reputation as a valid vehicle source among both Legislators and the public! (I will not state all the obvious injurious issues that a crash can cause in this article) Every rider knows that s/he must keep his/her head clear and constantly watch for issues on the roadways at all times - so let's all try harder to maintain awareness and safe handling practices when we roll on that throttle! Try to ride as if everyone who sees you hates motorcycles and you have the ability to prove them wrong!

I want to take a few lines here to update members on Brian Lange's campaign status. So far his campaign has made it into several of the District's newspapers (20th District): Good articles in The Daily News (Apr 14), The Chronicle, and The Reflector (May 6) and in the East County Journal (May 13). You can also follow Brian's campaign efforts via his Facebook page: Elect Brian Lange for 20th District Position 1 R.

Remember - the public's perception, and acceptance, of motorcycles begins with us! Ride safely!


GOLDENDALE - Greetings from Goldendale!

Elk Country Chapter

MORTON - Hey friends! I have a very special story to share this month, done so with full permission from the subject to share her name and all the details. For starters, she's a brand new member of Elk Country, so I'll start with a warm welcome to Michele!

On January 14th, at 7:45 am, Michele was driving on Hwy 12. It was her 15th wedding anniversary, and a heavy snow was falling—lots of snow already on the roads. She was being safe and careful, driving with studded tires and only going about 30 mph in her reliable Dodge Caravan. A big SUV was coming from the opposite direction, flying (for the road conditions) at 50 mph. When the SUV driver tapped the brakes, they lost control of their vehicle causing the back end to whip around, blocking Michele's lane entirely, and with no reaction time. She t-boned the SUV full force.

Rather than being knocked out in the impact, Michele remained fully awake and aware as all four of her limbs were destroyed. She had multiple compound fractures, broke both femurs just above the knees, broke both forearms, cracked ribs on both sides, and shattered one hip. She remained awake and feeling through her trip to the Morton ER, and then the helicopter ride to Tacoma General. Finally, pain medication was administered.

Michele spent a full 102 days hospitalized (6 weeks at Tacoma General before being moved to a skilled nursing facility). At no point was she able to get up, leave the bed, stand; she could not bear any weight on her legs. She underwent multiple surgeries: replaced the shattered hip, and surgeries on both arms and both legs. After healing from all of those, both legs required a second round of surgeries to transplant bone into both femurs. Then the healing process began again. Throughout every step of this tragedy that was so undeserved, Michele kept the most positive attitude I've ever seen. She fought every day to work any muscles she could, and to use her brain and stay productive. She set little goals to work toward and crushed them all because she just needed to. It was truly inspiring from an outside perspective, and she gave many around her a healthier perspective on life.

Finally, on April 24th, being able to bear weight on only one leg and using a walker and wheelchair, Michele was able to return home. Her home had been modified with a ramp and handicap accessible bathroom by her stellar employers and team at Randle Woods (and I do mean stellar—they've gotten me out of a scrape as well!).

Almost immediately after getting back home, Michele employed my help in finding her a motorcycle. She hasn't ridden in many years, but now knows that if life can be stripped away at any moment, you damn well better do what makes you happy every day, so she's getting back on 2 wheels! We found her dream bike, and Hardtail and I went to inspect it, test ride it, make a deal, and bring it home. "Scooter," a sweet 2007 Yamaha V-Star 1100, is now Michele's motivation in the very long healing process that still lies ahead. She has something to work toward, something to look forward to. In addition, she is now a 5-year member of Elk Country, so she has a huge new "family" waiting to welcome her!

I hope you are all well, and remember to do what you love as often as possible. ◊


