





It has become more and more important that we have people from each district at Black Thursday, it seems that the majority of legislators no longer want anything on paper, they want their constituents from their districts to come in in person and talk to them. We did have some people that went to other districts legislators and had some success in passing the word along which does help so thank you to all that participated in the fight for motorcycle rights. I wish I had the time and room to thank everyone personally because everyone there made a difference but I have to send out a big thank you to Louise Bentley, Brian Lange, and Scott Robinson for all

of their work.

Our swap meet is coming up in March and seems to be moving right along, thank you Jenny Rodgers for stepping into the role of swap meet chairperson on top of all of your other jobs. Jimmy George and the rest of the committee are working on the spring opener on June 25th through the 28th at the Silver Ridge Ranch in Easton. Not many changes going on for this event with the exception of the raffle, this year all of the raffle prizes are a need not be present to win so let's get out there and sell these raffle tickets. January 2019 Legislative Report

Another successful Black Thursday is in the books! Even though the weather held out fairly nicely for the actual Black Thursday, bad weather and unsafe conditions leading up to the day were enough to keep the ride-in participation lower than normal. There was, however, a good group on the Capitol steps to listen to speakers and show support for our legislative causes. We had a great lineup of speakers this year, including Brian Lange, Scott Robinson, Lyle Cole, Larry Walker of the Washington Road Riders Association, Representatives Kelly Chambers (25), Chris Gildon (25), and an enthusiastic impromptu speech from Rep. Brad Klippert (8), I want to thank Brian Lange for spearheading the

ride-in and events on the steps as I was tied up with an extended meeting the was offered to us by Speaker of the House, Rep Jinkins. I would also like to thank Alan Alder (Spanaway, LAO) for staying with me during the extended meeting and thus missing the ride-in himself.

There was a low response from Chapters as far as getting meeting appointments with their respective Legislators - that plus this being a short session and an election year, left us with fewer meetings than I had hoped to get. We did, though, have very productive meetings with the Chairs of both House & Senate Transportation Committees, and the LA for Speaker of the House Jinkins, David Bremer (who is a rider too!). We even had a visit from Senator Braun (20) who came down to the Columbia room to talk with his constituents. In all, we met with 46 Representatives (or their LAs) and 29 Senators (or their LAs), including all of the ones on the Transportation Committee. With the help of several members acting as "Runners", we did manage to stop by every Legislator's office to drop off materials with our bill information - though not all Legislators accepted our paperwork due to new paper regulations and requirements imposed on them. I would like to thank all the members who served as a "Runner," especially Pete Reeves (Piglet, Spanaway) who covered most of these office drop-ins. And of course, Black Thursday wouldn't be complete without the after party. The Meet & Greet was a success as well! Six Legislators attended our Meet & Greet: Representatives Jenkin,(16), Mosbrucker (14), Klippert (8), Boehnke (8), Schmick (9), and Senator Fortunato (31) who entertained us with his personal rendition of: I've Got Friends In Low Places".

ABATE of WA was invited, by Eagle Leather, to hold a Q&A session at their Lakewood shop following Black Thursday. On January 25th we discussed Bills that affect riders that are currently on the calendar for this year, including our three: Helmet Choice, Lane Sharing and Parking. There were about 20 people who participated in this event and I believe we made strides in spreading the word to the motorcycle community about who & what we are. It was nice to see so many ABATE members show up to support this event too (chapters: Tacoma, Elk Country, Spanaway, Star Lake, and possibly others).

The legislative calendar for this year is condensed as it is the second half of the biennium, thus a short session. The important dates to pay attention to regarding our bills are:

- •February 19th, the last day to pass bills out of the house of origin (our Parking Bill has met this date already) At the time of writing this article, the Lane Sharing and Helmet Choice Bills are still active
 - •February 28th, Last day to pass Bills out of Committee from the opposite house
 - •March 2nd, last day to pass Bills and read them on the floor for Transportation Committee
 - •March 6th, Last day to pass Bills out of the opposite house if our Bills do not make this cutoff date then they are dead

By the time you read this report, we may already know the status of our Bills,

Supporting the Bills that ABATE of WA puts forth is the heart of what ABATE, as an organization, does and Black Thursday is a big part of pushing our legislation through our cumbersome legal process. Success for us is directly related to how much effort every member puts into our organization. The success of this year's Black Thursday, with all its unique challenges this year, would not have been possible without all the dedicated effort from so many of you. It would be almost impossible to thank everyone individually, but I hope every member knows how much your efforts to support ABATE of WA's legislative goals are appreciated and respected.


Key Peninsula Chapter





GENERAL

- As a courtesy to shoppers, VENDORS MUST REMAIN SET UP UNTIL THE CLOSE OF EVENT AT 3PM, Sunday, March 22.
- The Swap Meet Committee will maintain a clearly identified registration booth on Saturday and during the morning on Sunday. Vendors need to check in to obtain wristbands, receipts, and table/chair rentals. SPACE NOT CLAIMED BY 8:30AM SUNDAY MAY BE RESOLD WITH NO REFUND.
- At check in, vendors will be issued two (2) wristbands per paid space or one (1) wristband per paid Bike Corral motorcycle. Additional wristbands
 are available at the registration booth for \$5 each. Vendors are expected to wear the wristbands throughout the event.
- A discount on space rental is offered to ABATE members. Dues must be paid up through March 2020 to be eligible. Any vendor joining or renewing membership at the Swap Meet is eligible for the discounted space rental rate. (Discount does not apply to Bike Corral.)
- ABATE reserves the right to refuse to accept any request for vendor space for any lawful reason.

CONFIRMATION

- Your canceled check confirms your space until the day of event at check in.

SET UP

- When unloading, do so as quickly as possible, then move your vehicle out of the building.
- Any motorcycle/engine in the building for sale or display shall have gas caps taped and engine batteries disconnected per Snohomish County Fire Marshal.
- Vendors must place tarps or mats under any equipment or parts that may potentially leak petroleum products or fluids, including batteries,
- No vendor may block or interfere with a neighboring vendor. Vendors must confine all vendor activities within the limits of the assigned space.
- Walls are to remain free of tacks, nails, wires, etc. Decorations and signage may not cover or block building exits, fire extinguishers, fire hoses, phones, electric panels or outlets.
- No canopies or roofed structures are permitted inside the building per Snohomish County Fire Marshal's Office.
- Equipment: Electrical ceiling drops for non-wall spaces can be arranged for an additional fee. Tables and chairs are available to rent if needed.
 The folding tables are not to be used outdoors.

MERCHANDISE/SERVICES/RESTRICTIONS

- Each vendor is responsible for his/her own tax liability.
- Vendors will not engage in the dispensing or sale of food or beverages.
- No animals (except service); no firearms; no parking lot sales; smoking prohibited in building and within 25' of doorway or intake system.

CLEAN UP

- Each vendor is responsible for the clean-up of his/her space including spills, trash, litter, etc., and the removal from the grounds of any personal items, parts, trash, etc. Vendors not complying may be assessed clean-up or trash removal fees.
- Vendors must be packed up and out the door no later than 6pm Sunday.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

- 15 days notice before the event is required for a full refund.

SECURITY

 Professional licensed and bonded uniformed security staff will patrol the event areas Sunday. The security service will not be responsible for loss of material by theft or for any cause.

OVERNIGHT CAMPING

- Vendors camping at the fairgrounds must have a pass displayed in the vehicle window and be parked in designated RV parking areas only.
 Water service is weather dependent and is generally not available in the month of March.
