

## Legislative Affairs Officer Brian Lange & Louise Bentley

## **April 2020 Legislative Report**

Well, the second half of the biennium (short session) is now over, as of March 12th. We've had some success with our legislative efforts, namely our Parking Bill and the Resolution to Proclaim May as Motorcycle Awareness Month.

In summary, the Legislative Calendar was: Feb 19 - Last day to pass bills out of house of origin Mar 2 - Last day to pass bills (out of opposite house) out of committee and read them into the record on the floor

Mar 6 - Last day to pass opposite house bills (5:00pm) Mar 12 - Last day allowed for regular session

In summary, our Legislative Bills are:

Helmet Pilot Bill - did not make final cutoff for advancement so Bill is dead for this session

Lane Sharing Bill - did not make final cutoff for advancement so Bill is dead for this session


Parking Bill - SB 6565, has made it through all cutoff dates (even with all the "re-arrangements" made to it by Legislators), and was submitted to the Governor's desk to be signed into law. (At the time of writing this report, our Parking Bill has passed through the legislature and is currently sitting on the Governor's desk awaiting his signature. By the time you're reading this report, however, the deadline to sign (or not sign) our Parking Bill will have passed. For updates on the status of our Bill, please refer to ABATE's website and/or ABATE's Facebook page).

We were also successful with our Motorcycle Awareness Resolution efforts. On February 27th, Senator Randall (District 26, Purdy area) presented the Resolution to proclaim May as Motorcycle Awareness Month in the Senate chamber. The Resolution passed unanimously and was forwarded on to the Governor's desk. We are currently awaiting for the Governor to officially proclaim May as Motorcycle Awareness Month. We would like to acknowledge and thank Kim Adair for all her efforts getting this important piece of legislative work done in good order.

There is an update to ABATE's website that is designed to help disseminate legislative information to members - especially those who don't get the Freedom newsletter. In addition to using Facebook and email to put out information to our members, our webmaster, Leon Staub, has added a new Legislative section which lists legislative updates. There is now a section entitled "News From Your LAO" located under the "Legislative" tab on the front page of the website. This LAO section is up & running and has informative legislative actions posted. Go to www.abate-wa.org, click "Legislative" then click "News from your LAO" from the drop down menu.

We will keep you all updated as we get information from the Governor's desk.


Lots going on. Thank you everyone that came out and helped make Night Out With EPCC a success. That was a great time. Signed up a couple new members and made some new friends.
